

**Proceedings of the Special Board Meeting held in the meeting hall of HKRDB Gulbarga on 07/02/2014 at 02-00 pm under the Chairmanship of H'ble Sri Qamar-Ul-Islam Minister of Municipal Administration, Local Bodies, Public Enterprises, Minorities and Chairman of Hyderabad Karnataka Region Development Board and District in Charge Minister Gulbarga.**

The members present : As per the attendance (List enclosed) register

Sri Amlan Aditya Biswas IAS. Secretary HKRDB welcomed the H'ble Chairman HKRDB and all the members of the Board present in the meeting.

As per the Gazette Notification No.DPAR 06 PLX 2012, Bangalore, issued by the DPAR (Hyderabad-Karnataka Special Cell) Dated 06/11/2013 new Board has been constituted which is being called as HKRDB i.e., Hyderabad Karnataka Region Development Board by amending the Article 371 (J) of Indian Constitution which extended special Status to this region. Accordingly as per Go.No: DPAR/50/HKR/2013 issued by the DPAR (Hyderabad-Karnataka Special Cell) on Dated:23-01-2014 – 28 Members HKRDB new Board has been constituted under the chairmanship of Sri. Qamar-Ul-Islam Minister of Municipal Administration, Local Bodies, Public Enterprises, Minorities and District in Charge Minister Gulbarga.

The Secretary has readout the above 28 members (list enclosed) list and has informed the house that 1/3 Quorum has been fulfilled i.e., out of 28 members 21 members were present in the meeting and requested the H'ble Chairman to preside over the meeting.

The H'ble Chairman HKRDB welcomed all the H'ble Members attended the meeting and briefly explained the subjects to be placed before the **meeting:-**

1. Preparation and submission of Action Plan for Rs. 150.00 Crores for the year 2013-14.
2. The action plan is prepared on the basis of CDI in relation to the allotment proposed, compared to the allotment made since 2001-02 to 2013-14 to all Talukas.
3. Giving administrative and supervision powers to DPAR.
4. Formation of District Level Advisory Council under the Chairmanship of District in Charge Minister, consisting of MLC's MLA's, DC, CEO. of the respective districts.
5. District level unit should be established by providing sufficient staff.
6. Budget estimate of Rs. 1350.00 Crores for the year 2014-15
7. Submission of proposals under 14<sup>th</sup> finance commission for release of Rs. 1000.00 Crores every year for a period of 05 years amounting Rs. 5000.00 Crores.

The H'ble Chairman asked the Secretary Sri Amlan Aditya Biswas to address the meeting duly explaining the details of the subjects placed before the meeting and requested all the members of the Board to take decisions on subjects.

The Secretary HKRDB detailed the subjects placed before the meeting and requested the members to take suitable decision. The H'ble members actively participated in the discussion and expressed their view points on the subject as detailed below.

**Subject 1**

**Action Plan for 2013-14**

a. Action Plan for Rs 150 Crore allocated for 2013-14 for HKRDB

i. Rs 100 Crore for Infrastructure Gaps

ii. Rs 50 Crore for Institutional Gaps

**Resolution 1**

b. Action Plan is placed before the Board for Approval for submission to HE the Governor of Karnataka for sanction.

The Members discussed on Note – 1 (a) of the subject in detail. Sri B.R. Patil MLA Aland Taluka and Member of the Board and Sri Ishwar Khandre MLA Bhalki Taluka and Member of the Board expressed that the grants shall be allotted on the need basis and norms shall be flexible and asked the Board to consider the proposals submitted by the member and MLA's. Sri K.B. Shanappa is of the opinion that the grants earmarked to the tune of Rs. 150.00 Crores can be utilized in the current financial year and it is practicable as only Feb./March 2014 are (remaining) left. The Secretary Sri Amlan Aditya Biswas IAS with the permission of the Chairman HKRDB. expressed that the planning for Rs. 150.00 Crores have to be prepared immediately with the approval of H'ble Governor. It has to be implemented as early as possible so that the grants can be utilized. Sri Basavaraj Rayareddy MLA Yelburga expressed that the development works shall be estimated to the Minimum of Rs. 25.00 Lakhs and small work as being done in HKADB should be avoided. The Secretary convinced the H'ble Members that their shall be no binding on cost of the estimates and only necessary works shall be planed. The H'ble MLA Sri Basavaraj Rayareddy continues and placed before the Board that the works of water supply and sanitation shall be executed on the Guidelines of the Suvarna Gramodaya Scheme. The H'ble Chairman expressed that all possible measures will be taken to implement the work as per Guidelines and Rules. Dr. Sharana Prakash Patil H'ble Minister for Medical Education and District in Charge Minister expressed that so as to utilize Rs. 150.00 Crores only big works at District Level can be taken up. But the members opined that only necessary works should be taken up at

taluka level / against the allocation made Dr. Chaya Degownkar expressed that CDI index of all the districts are ready and as per the development index the works can be executed / implemented. After detailed deliberation all the members accepted the proposals placed before the meeting allocating Rs. 100.00 Crores towards infrastructure development and Rs. 50.00 Crores towards institutional development as included in the Annexure – 1 and resolved to submit the proposals to his highness H'ble Governor of Karnataka.

## Subject 2

### Principles Adopted for inter se distribution between districts and talukas.

## Note 2

### a. Principles Adopted for inter se distribution 2013-14.

- i. Taluka has been adopted as unit.
  - ii. The CDI has been adopted as the benchmark.
  - iii. The historical allocation from 2001 to 2014 for HKADB has been measured against the CDI based share and the difference has been identified as "Historical Gap" within the region. This gap is to be closed within 2 years.
  - iv. For those "relatively developed talukas" like Bellary, Hospet and Bidar where CDI is 0, an ad hoc 0.05 CDI has been adopted till more refined study is done.
  - v. Administrative and Board Expenditure which includes Salaries and Non-Salary Administrative Expenditure, Operation & Maintenance, Research and Publications etc has been kept at 4% of Institutional Funds ( ie 1.3% of total funds)
  - vi. With respect to Infrastructure Grants :Total Rs. 75.32 Crore of Infrastructural Historical Gap is identified of which Rs. 15.06 Crore is to be additionally allocated to certain Talukas proportionately in 2013-14. Balance Rs. 60.26 Crore is to be allocated in 2014-15. Rs. 84.94 Crore is allocated as per CDI and the ad hoc CDI norms adopted above.
1. Urban – Rural re-allocation is done on basis of respective populations as per 2011 Census
  2. For the 2013 – 14 Action Plan in Infrastructure Development, 80% is allocated for Connectivity and 20% for Water Supply and Sanitation



3. For the 2013 – 14 Action Plan in Institutional Development, 70% is allocated for Health Institutions and 30% for Social Sector Institutions.

vii. With respect to Institutional Grants: Total Rs 48 Crore is allocated (excluding Rs 2 Crore for Administrative Purposes) on the basis of CDI and ad hoc CDI norms for Bellary, Hospet and Bidar.

1. Urban – Rural re-allocation is done on basis of respective populations as per 2011 Census
2. For the 2013 – 14 Action Plan in Institutional Development, 70% is allocated for Health Institutions and 30% for Social Sector Institutions

b. Principles adopted are placed before the Board for Approval for submission to HE the Governor of Karnataka for sanction.

#### Resolution 2

1. The H'ble Board members gone through the Note – 2 (a) (enclosed to the Annexure – 1 ) and participated in the detailed discussion regarding allotment of infrastructure and institutional funds district wise and taluka wise based on the CDI.

The Secretary HKRDB explained in detail how the allotments were made considering the allotment made since 2001-02 to 2013-14 calculating the ratio and allotments to be made based on the CDI to fill up void created which is considered "Historical Gap". He is kind enough to explain with examples how the gap has been created, which is to be made good to fill up the difference by allotting additional funds.

The members duly looking into Note – 2 (a) i, ii, iii, iv, v, vi and vii as included in the Annexure – 1 accepted the proposals placed before the meeting and resolved to submit proposals to his Highness H'ble Governor of Karnataka for sanction.

**Secretary HKRDB to be notified as Drawing & Disbursing Officer.**

#### Note 3

a. The Secretary HKRDB to be notified as Drawing and Disbursing Officer with financial powers as given for Secretary to Government.

b. Placed before the Board for Approval for submission to HE the Governor of Karnataka for sanction.

#### Resolution 3

The Board duly looking into Note – 3 (a) accepted the proposals placed before the meeting and resolved to submit proposals to his H'ble Governor of Karnataka to delegate Drawing and Disbursing Powers to the Secretary HKRDB. Gulbarga.

**Note 4**

**Notify DPAR as the Administrative Department for HKRDB**

- a. The Cabinet Sub-Committee on 371 J has been dealt with by DPAR
- b. The Hyderabad Karnataka Region is notified as special responsibility of HE the Governor of Karnataka
- c. Hence DPAR should be the Administrative Department
- d. Placed before the Board for Approval for submission to HE the Governor of Karnataka for sanction.

**Resolution 4**

The Board duly looking into the details placed in the Note – 4 (a), (b) and (c) discussed the matter and resolved to submit proposals to his highness H'ble Governor of Karnataka to delegate Administrative and Supervisory Powers to DPAR.

**Subject 5**

**Dissolution and Merger of HKADB with HKRDB.**

**Note 5**

- a. In view of the special responsibility of the Hyderabad Kanataka Region as notified U/A 371 J of the Constitution and in view of the Orders of the Government of Karnataka, specific orders dissolving the HKADB and merging it with HKRDB with all assets and liabilities and posts need to be adopted.
- b. The HKADB works will be continued separately till they are completed.
- c. The Administrative Department would change from Planning Department to DPAR. The HKADB works sanctioned will continue to be monitored by Planning Department.
- d. Placed before the Board for Approval for submission to HE the Governor of Karnataka for sanction

**Resolution 5**

The members of the Board discussed the matter and Sri Sharana Prakash Patil H'ble Minister of State for Medical Education informed to all the members that the decision has already been taken on the subject of Note – 5 (a) regarding marger of HKADB into HKRDB with all the assets and liabilities.

On the remaining para's of the Note – 5 (b) and (c) the members accepted the proposals and resolved to submit proposals to Government of Karnataka for approval.

**Subject 6**

**Guidelines for HKRDB and Advisory Committee.**

**Note 6**

a. The Advisory Committee in each district will be headed by the concerned District Minister and will have the following members:

- I. Deputy Commissioner – Member Secretary
- II. President Zilla Panchayat – Member
- III. MP Loksabha – Member
- IV. MP Rajya Sabha – Member
- V. All MLAs of the District – Members
- VI. All MLCs of the District - Members
- VII. All Presidents of Taluka Panchayats – Members
- VIII. All Presidents of Urban Local Bodies – Members
- IX. Chief Executive Officer – Member
- X. HKRDB Experts & Vice Chancellors of Universities located in the District – Special Invitees

b. The Advisory Committee will meet at least twice a year and prepare the detailed plans strictly as per the guidelines given by the HKRDB.

c. The HKRDB will meet at least every quarter.

d. The detailed action plans for 2013-14 may be obtained from the concerned District Ministers and Board Members in view of lack of time and closure of financial year. If the detailed plan is not received by 15<sup>th</sup> February, 2014 the available plans would be executed to avoid lapse of funds.

e. The selection of works and projects should follow the following guidelines:

- i. Infrastructure works of roads, drains & bridges should be such that they establish connectivity of a village or town to a major road or between two villages or towns. Internal roads and drains are not to be taken up.
- ii. Water Supply projects should be selected on the criterion of LPCD and chemical / biological contamination ( existing LPCD should be less than 20). Water Supply Projects should be comprehensive (including source, pumping, raising main, distribution facility, storage tank, treatment and energisation).

- iii. Sanitation projects should be selected on the basis of low performance in Total Sanitation Program and should be of public nature and comprehensive ( include Public Toilet, Electrification, Water Supply, Pits, Wash basin, provision for children, physically challenged and women separately). Bio-digester toilet complexes may also be proposed. A daily O&M plan and provision should be made by employing one person locally for every 10 toilets.
- iv. Health Institution projects should concentrate on only life saving and child care equipment, quarters for doctors and nurses and 24X7 power supply for rural PHCs and CFCs. For urban areas only medical equipment may be proposed.
- v. Social Sector Institution projects should concentrate only on Hostels and Anganwadis. Facilities such as Bedding, Two-tier Cots, Cooking and Dining Facilities and Building Infrastructure may be proposed.
- vi. All proposals must ensure un-encumbered and sufficient land is available.

#### Resolution 6

The Board discussing on Note – 6 (a), (b), (c) and (e) gave its approval and an Note – 6 (d) the Board discussed at length that the time available to utilize the grants to be released during 2014-15 is very short and end of financial year is fast approaching. It is advisable to consult the members of the district level advisory council members instead calling a special meeting and to get the proposals by 15<sup>th</sup> Feb. 2014.

The Board members were also expressed that if planning and execution is not done immediately it is not possible to utilize the grants. The Secretary HKRDB. brought to the notice of the Board that grant released are not lapsable. The members opined that the proposals shall be got as early as possible and resolved to submit the proposals to H'ble Governor of Karnataka for approval.

#### **Implementing and Executing Authorities.**

#### **Subject 7 Note 7**

- a. For works and projects within the district the concerned Deputy Commissioners and the Chief Executive Officers of Zilla Panchayats would be the executing authorities and would give the Utilization Certificates. For works and projects involving more than one district, the Secretary HKRDB or the Regional Commissioner Gulbarga Division will be the executing authority.
- b. All Implementing and Executing Authorities will compulsorily follow the provisions of the KTPP Act. In view of urgency, for 2013-14 short term tenders may be called as per KTPP Act individually or in packages of similar and/or contiguous works.



- c. State and Central Government competent agencies like PWD, PRED, KLAC, Nirmithi Kendra, Cashutech etc may be adopted as implementing agencies subject to provisions of KTPP Act. Works should not be proposed for agencies which are not competent to carry out the same and overloading of agencies should not be done. Final allocation of agency will be done by Secretary HKRDB.
- d. All procurement is to be done by the executing authority only as per KTPP Act.
- e. No furniture, equipment or vehicles are to be procured for administrative, monitoring or other non-functional purposes unless specific prior approval of the Board is taken.
- f. All works and projects must include maximum of 0.5% provision for Project Proposal & DPR(where required), 0.5% for Technical Sanction (where required) and 1% Third Party Inspection & Quality Control. Third party will be appointed by Secretary HKRDB.
- g. Technical Sanction should be obtained from competent authorities as notified by the State Government.
- h. Fund Release will be done as follows:
  - i. 5% on sanction & DPR approval
  - ii. 20% on Tender approval
  - iii. 50% on 50% physical completion
  - iv. 20% on full physical completion
  - v. 4% on satisfactory 3<sup>rd</sup> Party Report
- i. Administrative approval would be given as follows:
  - i. Upto Rs 5 Crore – The Secretary, HKRDB
  - ii. Upto Rs. 10 Crore – Government
  - iii. Above Rs. 10 Crore – Cabinet
- j. Placed before the Board for Approval for submission to HE the Governor of Karnataka for sanction

The members looked into the Note – 7 (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g), (h) and (i) approved all the subjects and asked to submit proposals to H'ble Governor of Karnataka for approval.



- Subject 8**                      **Additional staff and administrative requirements for HKRDB**
- Note 8**
- a. The additional responsibilities, scope and scale of HKRDB are 3 times that of HKADB.
  - b. Hence the proposal is made to provide additional staff and administrative provisions for HKRDB
  - c. Additional Vehicles for Chairperson, Secretary & Staff
  - d. Acquisition of land for Quarters and Guest House for out-station members
  - e. Additional Computers, Equipment, Furniture
  - f. Additional Hospitality and Security Staff on outsource basis
  - g. Placed before the Board for Approval for submission to Government for sanction.
- Resolution 8**                      The members on the subject and Note – 8 (a), (b), (c), (d), (e) and (f) discussed the matter in detail and opined that only such posts which are necessary for smooth administration of the Board can be created, as it is a recurring expenditure. The appointments shall be made on deputation or obtained through outsourcing as included in the Annexure – II and III. The members accepted and resolved to submit the proposals to his Excellency H'ble Governor of Karnataka.

- Note 9**
- a. The Budget Provision for 2014-15 for Rs 1350 Crore has been submitted to State Government.
  - b. Placed before the Board for Ratification for submission to HE the Governor of Karnataka for Sanction.
- Resolution 9**                      The members discussed the Budget proposals amounting to Rs. 1350.00 Crores (As per the Annexure – 2, 3 and 4) submitted to the Government and approved the proposals already submitted and resolved to submit the proposals to his Excellency H'ble Governor of Karnataka for approval.
- Subject 10**                      **Action Plan for 2014-15**
- Note 10**
- a. Action Plan for 2014 – 15 for Rs 1000 Crore only is submitted.
  - b. Allocation for Infrastructure Gap filling is proposed at 70% and for Institutions at 30%. Administrative charges is continued at 4% of Institutional allocation.

- c. Priority sectors for Infrastructure Gap Filling for 2014-15 are identified as : Connectivity – 50%, Water Supply & Sanitation – 20% and Minor Irrigation – 30%
- d. Priority Sectors for Institutional Gap Filling for 2014-15 are identified as : Health Institutions – 50%, Social Sector Institutions – 30% and Child Welfare Institutions – 20%.
- e. Action Plan is placed before the Board for Approval for submission to HE the Governor of Karnataka for sanction.

Resolution 10      The members of the Board on the subject and Note – 10 (a), (b), (c) and (d) discussed the matter and approved the action plan for the year 2014-15 (as per Annexure - 5) and resolved to submit proposals to his Excellency H'ble Governor of Karnataka for approval.

**Subject 11      Setting up of District Level Monitoring Cell.**

**Note 11**

- a. It is anticipated that the volume, scale, scope and complexity of the HKRDB will require setting up of District Level Monitoring Cell at the district headquarters to assist the Deputy Commissioner and Member Secretary, Advisory Committee to effectively plan, execute and monitor the works and projects as also collect data and information, conduct local evaluation and impact assessment studies, prepare project reports / policy suggestions and monitor reservation in jobs.
- b. Hence it is proposed to constitute a District Level Monitoring Cell comprising 1 Civil Engineer, 1 Economist, 1 Accountant, 1 Statistician, 1 FDA, 1 Data Entry Operator in each District under the Deputy Commissioner to be filled up on Deputation / Out Source basis.
- c. Placed before the Board for Ratification for submission to HE the Governor of Karnataka for Sanction

Resolution 11      The members of the Board on the subject and Note – 11 (a) and (b) discussed the matter and approved the proposals and resolved to submit proposals to his Excellency H'ble Governor of Karnataka for approval.

**Subject 12**

**Creation of a post of FDA in Office of Assistant Commissioner of the Sub-divisions to assist in giving Eligibility Certificate**

- a. Eligibility certificates have to be issued for those claiming to be from local region. This responsibility lies with the Assistant Commissioners of the Revenue Sub-divisions. Hence it is proposed to create a post of one FDA to be filled up on deputation basis in the Office of the Assistant Commissioners.
- b. Placed before the Board for Ratification for submission to HE the Governor of Karnataka for Sanction

**Resolution 12**

The members of the Board discussed the subject and Note – 12 (a) The H'ble members Sri Priyanka Kharge, Dr. Umesh G. Jadav and others is of the opinion that the people of the Border areas of the other states and Districts, may misuse and there is every possibilities that they may mis-utilise the provisions of 371 (J) on bogus certificates issued by the authorities.

The suitable action should also be initiated against such authorities who are responsible for issue of bogus Eligibility Certificate which certainly attracts penal clause. The members also expressed that suitable measures should be taken to appoint vacant Group-D posts and other post as per 371 (J) provisions. The chairman promised to initiate suitable action as per the provisions and all the members accepted resolved to submit proposals to his Excellency H'ble Governor of Karnataka for approval.

1. Creation of Legal Cell – 01 head Advisor, 02 Law Officers and 01 Data Entry Operator on out source basis.

Policy provision to encourage private investment and ensure regional balance – all HKRDB works, locally registered and resident contractors to be given priority in 70 % of works above Rs. 05.00 Crores, 80% of works above Rs. 02.00 Crores and 90 % of works below Rs. 02.00 Crores if eligible contractors are available.

On the subject and Note – 13 (1), (2), (4), (5) and (6) placed before the meeting on Note 13 (3) the members agreed to the following proposals .

- 1) Sitting fee - Rs. 1000.00 per sitting
- 2) T.A. / D.A. - Rs. 500.00 DA. and if private vehicles Were used mileage allowances as approved.

(ii)

1. Sri Priyanka Kharge continuing his discussions and expressed that the HKRDB shall not limit its activities and concentrate on the overall development of the Hyderabad Karnataka Region by properly planning in the area which needs concentration.

- a. To declare tax holiday on starting industries, providing land, water and electricity for attracting investors.
- b. To acquire minimum 1500 Acres of land, creating land bank or atleast 500 Acres of land in all the districts, So that the required land can be duly allotted to the new enterprises and industrialists and establishing SEZ in all the district of HKRDB.
- c. To utilize Solar energy as the major source of energy in the region and establishment of Solar Park in all the district of HK regions, so that the energy needs to the extent of 30 % of the area can be metout, which is a boost for new industries comingup in the region.
- d. The standard / quality of the education shall be improved directly as the districts of HKRDB region are lagging behind the other districts of the state. All schools shall be provided with necessary furnitures, computers, laptop with Broad Band connections and necessary facilities.
- e. All the Gram Panchayats shall be connected with Broad Band facilities so that benefits can reach the villagers (providing BPL services) easily.



f. Reservation in Jobs / promotions shall be watched and see that proper guideline issued by the Government shall be followed.

2. Dr. Ajay Singh MLA Jewargi expressed that the Schemes like Udyoga Mitra shall be connected through BPL so that employment opportunities can be provided to the educated youth of the region.

3. Sri B.R. Patil MLA Aland opined that in the Gulbarga district and other districts of the Hyderabad Karnataka Region there is acute shortage of water and electricity even though the Government has spent crores. The problem cannot be solved and the farmers are facing many problems and asked the Board to findout the permanent solution. The opinion of the experts shall also be obtained on priority to findout a solution.

4. Sri Ishwar Khandre MLA Bhalki placed before the meeting that the reservation provisions under 371 (J) is not followed in the recruitments in VTU and KMF. Dr. Sharana Prakash Patil H'ble State Minister prior to the appointment / recruitment the clearance of DPAR shall compulsorily be obtained so that the reservation provision extended in promotions / appointments can be supervised and said that any violations will be treated seriously and action will be initiated accordingly.

The members opined that to remind DPAR once again so that 371 (J) in promotion / recruitments will be supervised meticulously

5. Dr. Sheshadri Expert opined the labourers / agriculturists are migrating to nearest cities for livelihood so that the Board can initiate action to prevent such migration duly creating employment opportunities.

6. The Secretary with the permission of the H'ble Chairman placed before the Board that the detailed studies is being conducting to arrive fresh CDI index. As soon as the report is published the Board can utilize the data published in the report. The H'ble Chairman expressed that new studies on the subject by the experts may throw light on the CDI.

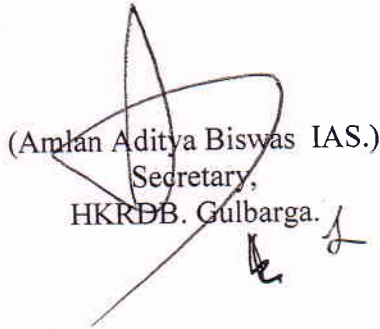
7. Release of Special Grants under 14<sup>th</sup> Finance Commission:

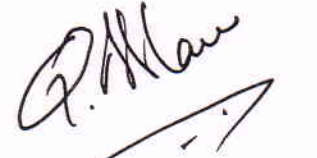
